4CM Pen Pal Program

Did you know that 4CM have a pen pal program with a class from Fort Logan, Northgate in Sheridan District 2, Colorado USA?

Why are we doing this?

Writing to a pen pal develops a child's curiosity. Wanting to know more about the world, events, and people is an important factor in ALL learning; the more we encourage our child's curiosity, the better learners they will become.

Having a pen pal develops compassion and understanding of other cultures and values. Writing to students who are different from themselves helps them to learn more about the world around them. Despite living in different environments, there are many things that make kids the same everywhere.

Reading and writing skills improve as students practice their writing skills and organize their thoughts onto paper. They are writing for a real purpose and a real audience who write back! Our class decided not to type their letters; they wanted to follow the traditions of being a good pen pal and use their best handwriting and make a good impression.

Having a pen pal promotes many life skills, including development of social skills. A letter filled with all "all about me" and no questions, does not make for a good pen pal relationship!

Letter writing promotes patience; delayed gratification! There is no instant text reply to our letters. We have to wait for our pen pals to write their letters and for their teacher Mr White to send them to Mrs Maier. Students experience the joy of anticipation and then the satisfying reward of getting something after a wait. This makes receiving our pen pal letters even more special!

Everyone has thoroughly enjoyed this experience and wanted to share with our school community one of the special things that is happening in our class.

Payments At The Office

As we are now using the new Department finance system could I bring to your attention the **POP** (**Parent on-line payment**) method which can be used 24/7 – at home or work through the School website. It is very simple and easy to use and a very secure method to pay for your child's school fees, excursions - saves time by not having to find cash or write a cheque. You can find it under "MAKE A PAYMENT" on the front screen of the school website. We also have an Ipad available for use at the front office if you do not have internet access.

Please note: NO EFTPOS facilities.

Parents can only use the POP method (see below), cash or cheque to make payments to the school.

New Payment Method now available (POP – Parent on-line payment)

It is now possible for parents to make online payments to the school for amounts owing for students, via a secure payment page hosted by Westpac. Payments can be made using either a Visa or MasterCard credit or debit card. The payment page is accessed from the front page of the schools website by selecting \$ Make a payment

Items that can be paid include voluntary school contributions, subject contributions, excursions, sales to students and creative and practical arts activities (these include band, drama and dance). There is also a category called Other. This is to cover items not covered in the previous headings. Other can be used to make a complete payment of a school invoice.

When you access the \$ Make a payment you must enter:

• the student's name, class and date of birth AND reason for payment (in reference section)

These details are entered each time you make a payment as student information is not held within the payment system.

This is a secure payment system hosted by Westpac to ensure that your credit/debit card details are captured in a secure manner, these details are not passed back to the school.

You have the ability to check and change any details of the payment before the payment is processed. Receipts can be emailed and/or printed.

Details of the payments are passed daily to the school where they will be receipted against your child's account. As a receipt has been issued from the payment page a further receipt will not be issued by the school.

For any enquiries regarding the Online Payment process please contact the School Administration Office.

Parking and Safety

Recently it has been brought to our attention that parents and children are crossing the road in front of the buses. Please promote road safety to your children by using the pedestrian crossings.

To ensure the safety of all students **do not park** on the **school crossing**. Please use the crossing with your child when crossing the road in Bennett and Endeavour Streets. **PLEASE DO NOT DO 'U' TURNS OVER OR ON THE CROSSING**.

As our school numbers have grown it will become increasingly difficult to park in and around the school.

Please **do not park across residents' driveways** as this makes it difficult for these homeowners to enter or exit

their driveway in the morning and afternoon.

Please do not park in the designated parking areas of the surrounding units.

Please help us to have a good reationship with our neighbours by respecting them and the parking rules around the school.

Speech Therapist

We again have the services of the Gladesville Speech Pathologist on site every week. If you think that your child needs speech therapy please come to the office and ask for a referral form. The Speech Pathologist will contact you directly to arrange a time that suits you. Please note that there is a cost involved and that this is **not a free service**.

School Visits and Safety Induction

When you come onto school grounds you will need to come to the front office and sign in to receive a visitor's badge. You will now also be required to a have a safety induction. The gates on Mons and Bennett Streets will be locked during the school day - please enter via Endeavour Street.

- 5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
- 6. Click "Open" when installed.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

Please Note: Some brands of Android phones need the setting in "Notification Manager" changed to "Allow" instead of "Notify" in order for the push notifications to work. The phone must also be running at least version 4 system software to run the app.

- 1. Go to the Windows Store on your Windows Phone
- 2. Search for "Skoolbag" in the keyword app search
- 3. Install the Skoolbag app.
- 4. Find your school either by using the keyword search or location service.
- 5. Click the "Pin" icon to pin the school tile to your Windows Phone home screen.
