#### **Deputy Principal's Message**

#### What is Visible Learning?

For teachers to be able to regularly evaluate their impact in their classroom and adjust their teaching methodology in response to what they see, their classroom needs to be made visible. The concept of seeing clearly what teachers are teaching and what students are learning is known as Visible Learning.

#### Who is Professor John Hattie?

John Hattie was born in Timaru, New Zealand, and has been Professor of Education and Director of the Melbourne Education Research Institute at the University of Melbourne, Australia, since March 2011. He was previously Professor of Education at the University of Auckland.

In 2009 Professor John Hattie published *Visible Learning: A Synthesis of Over 800 Meta-Analyses Relating to Achievement*. This ground-breaking book synthesized the findings from 800 meta-analysis of 50,000 research studies involving more than 150 million students and it built a story about the power of teachers and of feedback, and constructed a model of learning and understanding by pointing out what works best in improving student learning outcomes.

Since then, John Hattie has continued to collect and aggregate meta-analyses to the Visible Learning database. His latest dataset synthesizes 1,500 meta-analyses of 90,000 studies involving more than 300 million students. This is the world's largest evidence base into what works best in schools to improve learning.

**Visible Learning @ WRPS -** Visible learning is all about children taking ownership for their learning.

Throughout 2018, staff have been working collaboratively to understand the importance of making our learning visible. This has manifested in the classroom in the form of 'learning intentions'; 'success criteria' and 'feedback' being introduced into the classroom vernacular. The theory behind this move is to focus students on their learning and give them parameters in which to measure their success.

#### **Learner Qualities**

The next step in the visible learning journey will be to introduce learner qualities to the school in 2019. The first step is to involve the students and task them with the creation of school 'mascot' who will be displayed around the school exhibiting all of the learner qualities that we want our students to exhibit when faced with a challenge at school.

#### **Mascot Competition**

#### **New Information for Parents – Opal Cards**

School student applications for 2019 open from Monday, 15 October 2018.

Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 **do not** need to re-apply **if** they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to <a href="https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails">https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails</a>

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2018 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2018, the system will automatically cancel a card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out during December 2018 and January 2019.
