### A Trip Down Memory Lane by Mr Logan and James Johnson

During the September holidays I was at school feeding the chickens. I had just entered through the gates by the kitchen garden when a gentleman, accompanied by his daughter and his grandchildren, asked if he could have a look around the school. This had been his primary school ... back in 1950!!

Of course I invited them in ... James Johnson, as he turned out to be, along with his daughter Meg and her children, his grandchildren. He told me he had wanted to show them his old school and was delighted to be able to have a look around. We went into F-block and he recalled how the librarian would bring a trolley of books around that you could borrow. It was gorgeous when he told me he had tingles down his spine being back at his old alma mater (even if only his primary school).

James was a student at West Ryde from 1950-1956 and was taught by Mr Hart and Mr Maloney. James was academically strong and was accepted into Fort Street High School. Unfortunately for James he was very young for his year and back in those days instead of accelerating students through the system it was felt that he was too young to go to high school and he was made to stay at primary school for another year. As he had already passed for high school entry, James spent the next year, 1957, working out of the principal's office running errands and assisting with whatever tasks were assigned to him. ### **New Information for Parents – Opal Cards**

School student applications for 2019 open from Monday, 15 October 2018.

Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 **do not** need to re-apply **if** they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to <u>https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails</u>

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2018 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2018, the system will automatically cancel a card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out during December 2018 and January 2019.For further information visit <u>https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts</u>

### **Making Online Payments**

It is now possible for parents to make online payments to the school for amounts owing for students, via a secure payment page hosted by Westpac.
