#### **Presentation Day**

As you would expect, holding a full Presentation Day ceremony this year was not possible. On Monday 7 December, we recognised the achievements of our students with an assembly, but unfortunately, parents were unable to attend.

We had our first whole school morning assembly since March where the 2021 Student Leadership Team were announced to all students. Following this, all class and additional awards were presented in grades or stages depending on numbers.

There will also be a video of the Principal's address and the outgoing Captains' speech that will be sent to families before the end of the school year as well.

### **Semester Two Reports**

Your child's Semester Two Report will go home on Friday 11 December. Our teachers use a wide variety of strategies and tools to assess student learning.

Assessment *for* learning, or formative assessment occurs throughout all lessons and provides information to adjust future learning. Assessment *of* learning, or summative assessment activities are also used throughout the year. Tools or strategies that are used by teachers to assess student learning include observations, discussions, authentic learning tasks, samples of learning, games, learning goals and student reflections. Teachers meet regularly to moderate student assessment activities to develop consistency of teacher judgement.

The comments for English and Mathematics reflect two areas your child is excelling at and two focus areas for future learning. Please take the time to read these with your child and praise them for what they are doing well and encourage and support the areas they need improvement on.

Along with the class and languages (Yr1-6) reports, most students across the school will also receive an English as an Additional Language or Dialect (EAL/D) report. More than 80% of our students are from a Language Background Other Than English (LBOTE) and are at different phases of their English language learning. The additional report will inform parents of their child's English Language Proficiency Phase.

If you require more information about your child's progress, please make a time to meet with your child's class teacher. Also if your family circumstances have changed and you require an additional copy of your child's report, could you please contact your child's class teacher.

### **School Canteen**

Earlier this term, the canteen tender process was completed and Bespoke Canteens was successful in gaining the position at WRPS. Bespoke Canteens will begin at the beginning of Term 1, 2021 and will be open 5 days a week, offering a variety of options for students from breakfast, recess to lunch. More information about their menu and ordering process will be sent to families in the new year.

I would also like to take this opportunity to wholeheartedly thank Amy Bested for her contribution and management of the school canteen for the past few years. She has done an exceptional job at supporting families and the school through the running of the canteen.

### **What Works Best**

Our school is committed to ensuring that how we teach your child is based on what we know makes the biggest difference to their learning. In our 2021-2024 school plan, we will focus on using the 'What works best' eight practices for effective teaching.

These practices include:

- having high expectations of your child.
- using explicit teaching in the classroom.
- giving effective feedback to your child on their learning.
- using data to inform how we teach your child.
- using regular and effective assessments so we know how your child's learning is going.
- supporting the wellbeing of your child by looking out for their mental, physical and emotional health.
- managing the classrooms well so they are safe, positive and stimulating environments for learning.
- making sure our teachers collaborate with each other, and experts outside the school, so teaching practice continuously improves.

In addition, research shows that greater levels of support and engagement from parents and carers are associated with better student academic and wellbeing outcomes. We also know that students learn more

effectively when the home and school environments form complementary and supportive roles for learning. It is for this reason that we are focused on continuing to foster the partnership between our school and parents.

The Department of Education has now released a 'What works best' resource for parents and carers, which provides tips for having conversations with your child about their learning. You can visit the department's Parent Hub where you'll find other tailored resources for parents and carers, as well as a message from the NSW Minister for Education the Hon. Sarah Mitchell MLC.

One of the activities was a coding task where students block coded different scenes from the novel "Singepoo Strikes Again!" by Paul Jennings using the iPad app "ScratchJr". Another activity was a parachute making challenge where students were presented with various materials to create a parachute that would stay in the air the longest.

Students used the design process throughout the challenge to improve and reflect upon their designs. Congratulations to Megan (2SY), Anika (2SY) and Vasisht (2SM) for creating the parachute which remained in the air for a record 5.02 seconds when it was dropped from the second floor of I-block!

## Wakakirri 2021

West Ryde will be participating in Wakakirri for the first time in 2021! Wakakirri is a 3-7 minute performance by a group of students who theatrically tell a story using a combination of dancing, creative movement and acting to pre-recorded music. Wakakirri is an Aboriginal word which means "to dance a story." The program is open to all students in years 2-6 and auditions will be held in early 2021.

### Why should students be involved in Wakakirri?

Wakakirri is Australia's largest performing arts event for schools which celebrates storytelling through dance. Wakakirri is a fantastic opportunity to develop students' performing arts skills and allows them to make new friends by collaborating with students from other years. Involvement in this program promotes student resilience, team work, confidence and self-esteem.

### Driving tips

- Allow extra travel time to get to places.
- Avoid alcohol if you plan to drive.
- Place packages in the boot or restrain them with a seatbelt to avoid them moving about, in case of a crash.
- Ensure pets are properly restrained

### Planning ahead

Now is a great time to think about how your family will travel to school in 2021. Walking, cycling or catching a bus to school is a great alternative to school zone congestion.

- Plan and practise a safe travel route with your child/ren.
- Identify safe crossing locations.
- Discuss how to spot dangers, like vehicles exiting driveways.

## Road safety on holidays

### A message from NSW Department of Education - road safety education

With the school holidays approaching, daily routines often change and everyone is a lot more relaxed. Different play locations and holiday destinations means changed traffic environments and new safety concerns. To help keep our children safe, we all need to remember these key road safety messages in these new environments:

#### **Point out the road safety differences and dangers.**

Roads, footpaths, parks, car parks and bike tracks can look very different in holiday areas or maybe totally foreign, especially if going overseas for your holidays.

#### **The best way to keep children safe is to actively supervise them.**

Talk and teach children about road safety every time you are out and about. Even on holidays it is important to actively supervise them.

#### **Talk to children about being a safe road user.**

When out walking talk about the safe decisions you make, they may not have experienced these situations before.

#### **Stop, look, listen, think every time you cross the road.**

If a child is aged 8 years or younger hold their hand when walking near or across roads. Up until at least 10 years old supervise them closely. When on holidays children can often be overly excited and not thinking about being safe.

#### **It's the law that everyone wears a helmet when riding a bike in a public place.**

It also makes good sense to wear a helmet when riding scooters and skateboards too! It is a great way to encourage always wearing a helmet.

#### **Click clack front 'n back every person for every trip.**

Safe travelling in the car on long distances means taking a break every two hours. Give your children fun things to do in the car so they don't distract the driver. If using a different car while on holidays check they are in the right child restraint for their age and size.

**Remind the other adults such as grandparents, aunts and uncles, who may be caring for your children while on holidays, about these key road safety messages. Take care and have a great holiday together.**
